Notice is hereby given of a Public Participation Process in terms of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations contained in section 24(5) of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA), as amended.

It is the intention of City of Cape Town's Transport and Urban Development Authority (CCT: TDA) to extend the existing portion of Houmoed Avenue from Fish Eagle Park in the west up to Lekkerwater Road. The project would also entail the upgrade of the informal settlement currently located to the north of the formal housing in Masiphumelele.
